Introduction:

- We started the question in this series. What do you want God to restore to you in 2016?
 Write them down. Visit them often.
- Restoration means to return something to a former, original, normal or unimpaired condition.

I. Restoration: Prelude to the Process

- A. Restoration is all though the Bible.
 - 1. It is the entirety of what God's word is all about.
 - 2. It is the theme of Jesus ministry.
- B. Restoration is work.
 - 1. It is work because it involves us!
 - a) I have to see the need and the possibilities in God.
 - b) Jn 6:29 "This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He sent."
- C. Restoration begins with observation and ownership.

II. Restoration: The Heart of God

- A. Restoration lets me see who He is.
 - 1. God desires to portray who He is through restoration.
 - 2. Job 42:10 "When Job prayed for his friends the Lord restored his fortunes. In fact the Lord gave him twice as much as before."
 - 3. Zech "Come back to the place of safety all your prisoners who still have hope. I promise this very day that I will repay two blessings, for each of your troubles."
 - 4. When God restores He restores to a place better than before.
 - 5. In other words, His ability to restore is so great that in the natural mind, it seems that we should make a mess of things so He can fix it. Ro 6:1 *Shall we sin that grace may abound?*
 - 6. The concept of restoration is so profound in scripture that we should be encouraged when we suffer loss. That is hope! It reinterprets difficult circumstance.
- B. Restoration lets me experience who He is.
 - 1. "Any area of my life that is without hope is an area under the influence of a lie." Bill Johnson.
- C. Restoration lets me become like who He is.
 - 1. Those who have experienced restoration become messengers of hope.
 - 2. Those with the most hope have the greatest influence.
 - 3. People need to know that there is a place called the stronghold of hope. Zech 9:12

III. Restoration: Partnering with God. Is 61 & Luke 4:18

- A. The need for restoration
 - 1. Man has needed restoration since the fall in the garden.
 - 2. Humanity is broken, diseased and dying. From the moment a child is born they are heading towards death.
 - 3. Christ came to reverse the curse of death.

- B. The anointing to restore
 - 1. The divine exchange
 - a) Ashes for a crown.
 - b) Spirit of heaviness for garment of praise.
 - c) blessing instead of mourning
 - d) festive praise instead of despair
- C. The command to restore.
 - 1. Is said that when the divine exchange has occurred the redeemed will:
 - a) re-build the cities
 - b) repair the cities
 - c) revive the cities

IV. Restoration the Process

- A. God is a Restorer
- B. I need restored. God restores those who cry out to him. He has the heart and the original blueprints
 - 1. First, Restoration begins when I realize and admit I need restored.
 - 2. Second, we have to believe that He has the original schematics and submit to the process.
 - 3. Third, I must repent and commit to the work.
 - 4. Fourth, enter into accountability.
 - 5. Fifth, abide in Him. Rest in Him. Walk with Him. Abide in Him.

V. Restoration: He Has Heard Your Prayers Ez 36 & 37

- A. God is a Restorer
 - 1. Ps 137 we put away our harps. It was a picture of their inability to find a song/God in the midst of their sorrow.
 - 2. The state of the bones 37:11 discouraged, depressed, humiliated and heart broken, filled with hate. 137:8 Smash their babies on the rocks.
- B. God takes the initiative
 - 1. Ezekiel prophesied to the land.
 - 2. Can these bones live again?
 - 3. Ezekiel prophesied to the bone.
- C. Back to reality.
 - 1. Next 10 years Ezekiel prophesied hope and worked to help them believe.
 - 2. 47:1-ff Everything the river touches lives.

Conclusion:

- Ezekiel, can these bones live? Only you know Lord.
- Jesus, Jn 10:10 I have come that you may have life and have it abundantly!
- The Restorer is come! Lets live! Choose to live! Choose to bring Life himself into your world!
